Phonics is:

making connections between the sounds of our spoken words and the letters that are used to write them down.





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Phonics



Children are taught how to:

- recognise the sounds that each individual letter makes;
- identify the sounds that different combinations of letters make such as 'sh' or 'oo';
- blend these sounds together from left to right to read words.

Children can then use this knowledge to 'decode' new words that they hear or see.



Phonics at St Vincent's

- At St Vincent's we are using Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Scheme of Learning.
- Children begin Little Wandle in Reception and continue through to Year 1 and beyond.
- There is a clear progression of learning and specific sounds are tricky words taught each term.
- Children are taught phonics daily and generally learn 4 new sounds each week with a review session on a Friday.
- Children are assessed every 5 weeks to review progress. Children who are not keeping-up with their peers will be given al practice immediately through keep-up sessions.

• The phoneme is the sound it makes



• The grapheme is how the sound looks when written down.

In the phonics scheme:

- Every letter has a mnemonic picture
- Every letter has a formation phrase



What is segmenting and blending?

Blending: Seeing a word and merging the phonemes together to read the word

Segmenting: Chopping up a word into separate phonemes to spell it out

Half Termly Assessments

Autumn 1

- All children are assessed on a 1:1 basis every 5 weeks.
- This demonstrates how well the children have picked up the sounds and are beginning to apply them.
- These assessment then help us to ensure the children are reading the phonics books linked to their ability.
- Keep up sessions provided to fill in any gaps they may have.

Reading Practice

Each week all children will engage in Reading Sessions within school – these are timetabled sessions and taught by a Teacher or Teaching Assistant and taught in small groups.

- Decoding sounding out and blending of words, recognising high frequency and tricky words.
- 2) Prosody using expression when reading.
- 3) Comprehension understanding what we are reading.

At the end of the week the book is then sent home to practice at home with parents.





Reading Practice Book

- Parents/carers play a <u>vital role</u>. It is important that children have plenty
 of practice reading at home in order to become fluent, confident readers.
- The reading books sent home will be matched to their phonic stage and will be fully decodable.
- Books will be sent home on a Wednesday so please do make sure you make time to read at least a couple of times over the weekend to really support your child.
- All children develop at different stages. When you child is confident with blending they will have a book with words.
- Each week we will send home blending support activities to continue to balk confidence.









Phonics fun!



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Tricky Words

- Tricky words are words are not phonically plausible, i.e. they can't be sounded out.
- When we teach a tricky word we explain to the children what is tricky about this word.
- At the end of the week when we have taught a new tricky word we will send home that word in the little pouches for you to practise at home. You may wish to copy it or write it on post it notes and put it around the house.
- By the end of Reception we aim to be able to read and spell all the tricky words we have taught over the year.



Reading for Pleasure....

- We have a selection of books for the children to browse both fiction and non fiction.
- Every week the children can take home a book to enjoy with family at home. (Wednesday)
- Children to return books to school each week and exchange for a new book.
- These books are to help develop reading for pleasure.

Some tips for sharing books for pleasure...



- Make the story sound as exciting as you can by changing your voice.
- Talk with your child as much as you can.
- Introduce new and exciting language.
- Encourage your child to use new vocabulary.
- Make up sentences together.
 - Find different words to use.
 - Describe things you see.



Early Learning Goal - Literacy - end of Reception Year

Comprehension

- Demonstrate understanding of what has been read to them by retelling stories and narratives using their own words and recently introduced vocabulary
- Anticipate key events in stories
- Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems and during role-play.

Word Reading

- Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs
- Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending
- Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, including some common exception words.

Writing

- Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed
- Spell words by identifying sounds in them and representing the sounds with a letter or letters
 - Minimple phrases and sentences that can be read by others.

Flash Cards

- Use flash cards to practice sounds.
- Take it in turns to be the teacher.

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- Hide sounds around the house for children to find and collect.
- Lay cards out on the floor and throw a bean bag/teddy and whichever it lands on you have to call out the sound.
- Build CVC (Consonant -Vowel Consonant) words using the cards to practice sounding out and blending.

The power of a post it note

- Writing simple CVC words and Tricky words on them and having around the house to practice reading.
- Hide words around the house, give children a word and get them to go find it and bring it to you.
- Labelling objects, initial sounds moving towards writing simple CVC words and little captions.
- Using UV pens to write words for children to read being secret spies!!
