


Year 5 'Numbers at Work'

On Monday, we were joined by the 'Numbers at Work' team which consisted of employees from Tatton Park, MACE and Manchester Airport. The team worked with our Year 5 class to demonstrate the importance of Maths in our daily lives and how it is used in different professions.

The children were split into groups and worked on tasks such as planning a holiday using a brochure of information and set budget. They also looked at roles, budget and practice in construction using 'marshmallows and cocktail sticks'. Finally, they had to calculate how much iron must be injected into the piglets in Tatton Park's farm.

We had a great morning and our children were surprised at how valuable Maths is in our everyday lives. A big thank you to the team who came in. From the feedback 93% of children rated it Brilliant or Good. 97% understand more about the importance of maths now, and 90% agree that adults use Maths every day. Other comments were around how much fun they had, but resoundingly they wanted longer sessions.
