#### Reception

EYFS Statutory Framework - Expressive Arts and Design

The development of children's artistic and cultural awareness supports their imagination and creativity. It is important that children have regular opportunities to engage with the arts, enabling them to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials. The quality and variety of what children see, hear and participate in is crucial for developing their understanding, self-expression, vocabulary and ability to communicate through the arts. The frequency, repetition and depth of their experiences are fundamental to their progress in interpreting and appreciating what they hear, respond to and observe.

In addition to the themes below, children have daily access to our creative area including paints, crayons, stamps, stencils and general crafting materials as part of their continuous provision. These are enhanced regularly to allow for experimenting and exploration of different tools and techniques. Adult led activities are planned to allow all children to experience different art and craft activities.
