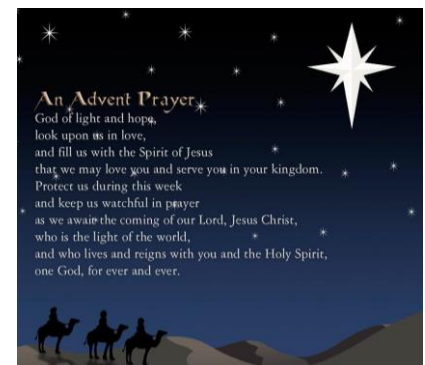

## Menu Change

On Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> December, the dinner choices will be Pasta Italiane or choice of sandwiches. Reminder:- Cheshire East Catering are increasing their prices significantly with effect from January 2024, and therefore we will have to increase the cost of paid school dinners to cover this increase. The cost of a child's school dinner will increase to **£2.65 per day from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024**. School dinners should be paid for in advance via ParentPay. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are still entitled to Universal Free School Meals. Pupil Premium children throughout KS2 are also entitled to free school meals. If you think your child is eligible for free school meals, please go to our school website and follow the link to apply directly with Cheshire East Council.
