

## Focus on.....Year 6

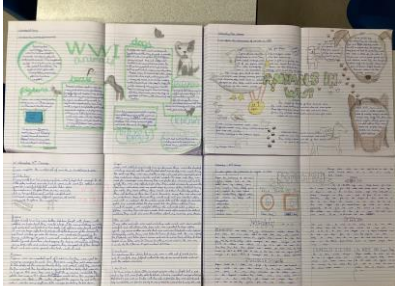
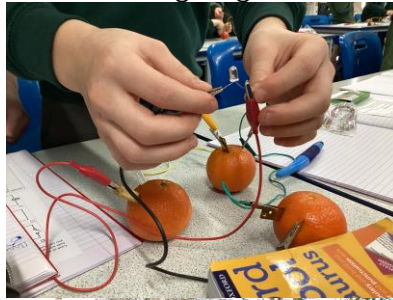
Year 6 have begun Spring term with a very busy first week. On Monday, during Forest School with Miss Hughes, we made bridges and experimented with using different natural materials to create secure and stable structures which would support vehicles and withstand aerial bombardments!

We finished our Science topic on electricity this week by investigating which fruits and vegetables could be used as batteries! Did you know that potatoes, lemons, kiwis and tomatoes all produce enough of a Voltage to power a small LED bulb?!

In our history lesson this week, we were fascinated to learn about how animals played vital roles during World War One and we produced some fabulous double page spreads in our books to celebrate the work of dogs, pigeons, horses and other animals - even camels and elephants!

In English, we are continuing with our project on Neil Gaiman's dark version of Hansel and Gretel. Mrs Bullen was very impressed with our character descriptions this week. This gem from Georgie was especially impressive, written about the children's mother: *As the pages turn, the cold-hearted, ruthless mother becomes greedy and selfish, devoid of the maternal affection that most mothers bestow upon their precious children.*

Together with continuing to focus on calculating with fractions in Maths and learning all about Sport vocabulary in French, it's safe to say we've earned a restful weekend before we go again next week!

## Time to Reflect by Mrs Davies



This week the focus was 'The Epiphany of the Lord' - Matthew 2:1-12. We hear how the Magi (the Wise Men) travelled from the East to see the Christ child. The word 'Epiphany' comes from the Greek, meaning 'showing' or 'manifestation'. It marks the end of the 'Twelve Days of Christmas' but not the end of the Christmas season which concludes at the Baptism of the Lord on the 8th January. We think of there being three men because there were three gifts, but Matthew does not mention a number. In the Eastern Churches, the tradition is that there were 12 Magi! The names by which we know the Magi in the West are Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar and they brought expensive gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. What gift can we give to someone this week? It doesn't need to be expensive!
