

## Focus on.....Year 4

Monday was an incredibly busy day. We had a fabulous time in Forest School, spending most of the morning outside building model volcanoes. We worked in teams, used our knowledge of the structure of volcanoes and even used chemical reactions with vinegar and baking soda to create the lava. It was great fun and our teachers were most impressed with our teamwork!



On Monday afternoons, we have our Love Music Trust lessons and we are becoming much more confident when playing our instruments. We had great feedback about our performance before Christmas and will be visiting The Bridgewater Hall to play with the Halle Orchestra later this year.

On Tuesday, Paul Sturgess visited school and worked with each class on basketball skills and tricks. We were amazed at how tall he was and also how incredibly skillful he was.

In Science, as part of the topic on Sound, we have been investigating the effect of distance on how well sounds can be heard from a source. Working in small groups, we used data-loggers to measure the change in decibels and noticed moved further away from a very noisy alarm the sound level reduced.



In English we are enjoying reading the book the Butterfly Lion by Michael Morpurgo which is set in Africa and in Artis we have been exploring how we can use our bodies to create the types of animals that would be found at the watering hole which features in the story. Have a look at the photographs. Can you guess which animals we are making?
