Fr. Davids 40th Ordination Celebration



Father David was thrilled to receive all the cards that the children had made to celebrate his 40 years of being a priest. He was impressed with all the writing, drawings and handprints that went into each of the cards from Pre-School to Year 6.

Y5 Forces Workshop

On Thursday Year 5 were treated to an all-day 'Forces' workshop led by scientist Mrs Watson. She came into school armed with lots of scientific equipment to teach us all about forces. The children got to carry out many experiments of their own, including weighing different materials and comparing their weights when they were dry and when they were submerged in water. They then used these values to calculate the amount of upthrust on each object. This led to a great discussion about gravity and why items float or sink. After this, children had to predict whether certain fruits would float or sink before finding out the real answers and why. We were amazed to learn that a bowling ball can float! The children also measured friction using a shoe and different surfaces, separated iron fillings from sand using magnets and watched how the coloured ink from felt pens spread across filter paper when dipped in water.
